Flanders

- → Flanders? Waste management is regional matter in Belgium
 - ¾ of all residential waste is reused, recycled or composted
 - From disposal, separate collection to source separation, recycling and prevention
 - Landfill ban for residential waste, home composting, pay as you throw,...
 - Since waste decree 1981, goals have always been met and exceeded
 - Yearly cost? € 200/habitant





Affordable sustainable waste management?

- → Outstanding results in our countries
- → Long history, resulting in excellent regulatory framework, best available technology, high public acceptance and involvement
- → Considerable financial investment





No two countries are similar

- 1. Developed, well-off countries, with scarcity of open space
- 2. Developed, well-off countries, with lots of open space
- 3. Developing, impecunious countries, with lots of open space





- → We are first of class, but our solutions are not 1:1 applicable
 - ► Too expensive?
 - Matter of priorities?
- → Environment does not respect country borders
 - What price are we willing to pay?
 - ► €10 extra investments in our country = marginal result Invest that same €10 in developing countries?
